Major reinforcement work on the metal structure of the Jacques Cartier Bridge in Longueuil

October 26, 2017

Dear Resident,

In 2014, The Jacques Cartier and Champlain Bridges Incorporated (JCCBI) started a major program to reinforce the metal structure of the Jacques Cartier Bridge in order to extend its service life until 2070. Over the next few weeks, major work on the steel structure will continue in Longueuil in the sector of Saint-Charles Street. This work will take place until fall 2018.

This program involves work on the steel structure that can generate local impacts, including noise. JCCBI has therefore implemented requirements to mitigate noise and dust and reduce traffic problems. For example, an acoustic enclosure will fully cover the work area but maintain user access on Saint-Charles Street. Preparatory work to install the enclosure will be done shortly. Other mitigation measures will help reduce noise from equipment.

Sound level readings will be taken to ensure the noise stays within the limits established in the sound monitoring plan. The contractor will contact owners and tenants in sensitive areas to get their permission to take these readings at the edge of their property. JCCBI believes that all of these measures will help reduce any irritants related to the work.

Note also that this major work will involve about ten night closures in the local network as well as a series of complete and partial closures of the bridge over the coming months.

As we are aware of the impacts of this work on sector residents and business owners, JCCBI will be holding an information booth so that residents can talk to JCCBI representatives and the monitoring team about the work.
