Rendezvous at the Jacques Cartier Bridge for the 35th Edition of L'International des Feux Loto-Québec

Longueuil, June 25, 2019 – Young and old alike are expected in large numbers on the Jacques Cartier Bridge for the 35th edition of L'International des Feux Loto-Québec. Montreal's skyline will be lit up starting June 29th. In total, 6 countries will be represented during eight theme nights.

To ensure spectator safety during the fireworks, The Jacques Cartier and Champlain Bridges Incorporated (JCCBI) would like to advise users that the bridge will be completely closed in the evening from 8:30 p.m. to 11:30 p.m. Access will be maintained for emergency services. The sidewalk and the multipurpose path will remain open for pedestrians only: cyclists will not be allowed to ride their bikes anywhere on the bridge.

Again, this summer, Montreal's skyline will shine bright on Wednesday and Saturday evenings as the world's greatest pyrotechnic artists display their talents:

- + Wednesday, July 10 – Stay Tuned (Portugal)
- + Wednesday, July 17 – Spirit of the Jungle (United States)
- + Saturday, July 20 – A First Walk on the Moon (Canada)
- + Wednesday, July 24 – Shapeshifter (Australia)
- + Saturday, July 27 – 25 years of entertaining you in style (Finale des Étoiles du Casino de Montréal)
